

Engagement Curriculum

The children in our classes (Rabbits and Hedgehogs) work from the engagement curriculum. This in short means that we work hard on building up the amount of time that children will 'engage' or take part in activities for. We spend lots of time working out what each child is motivated by and giving them opportunities to access this regularly. The activities on this padlet cover all the taught aspects that we would do in group time and some 1:1 activities. However I cannot put all the toys and activities we have available during sessions in school on here. So when you look through this padlet and have a go at the activities, remember that your child would be playing with toys in between the adult led activities, so have toys out at home too! This might give you the opportunity to see what they are currently enjoying and what they don't!

Ice Play

Freeze toys and let your child explore how the ice melts and frees their toys. Give them a spoon to speed up 'digging' out their toy.

Mark Making

Squiggle Time - find any pens / pencils and scrap paper - encourage your child to make marks with the writing tools. Model this for them, they may join in when they see you doing it. Consider where you do this, some children like lying on their tummies, sitting on the floor or sitting at a table.
